EXPEDITION VESSEL

M/V Nanook ex Nordsøen was a Danish fisheries control and search and rescue vessel, delivered in 1968 to the National Board of Fisheries by Frederikshavn Vaerft & Tördok in Fredrikshavn, Denmark.

Nordsoen has a sister vessel named Nordjylland built 1967.

The two vessels were the largest of the Fisheries Board's control vessels and the only ones operating in the North Sea and the Skagerrak. Their main area of work was fisheries control, but they were both also equipped for emergency towing, and were part of Denmark's emergency response force for sea rescue.

In 2022 the vessel has been converted in Gdansk (Poland) into and Expedition vessel and start cruising in February 2024.
